Dress Code (from the IMS handbook)

Student Appearance: (Ref: School Board Policy 502.1)

The board believes inappropriate student appearance causes material and substantial disruption to the school environment or presents a threat to the health and safety of students, employees and visitors. Students are expected to adhere to standards of cleanliness and dress that are compatible with the

requirements of a good learning environment. The standards will be those generally acceptable to the

community as appropriate in a school setting. The board expects students to be clean and well-groomed

and wear clothes in good repair and appropriate for the time, place, and occasion.

• Clothing or other apparel promoting products illegal for use by minors and clothing displaying

obscene material, profanity, or reference to prohibited conduct are disallowed.

• While the primary responsibility for appearance lies with the students and their parents,

appearance disruptive to the education program will not be tolerated.

When, in the judgment of a principal, a student's appearance or mode of dress disrupts the educational

process or constitutes a threat to health or safety, the student may be required to make modifications. It is

the responsibility of the superintendent, in conjunction with the principals, to develop administrative

regulations regarding this policy.

Indianola Middle School respects students' rights to express themselves in the way they dress. All students

who attend Indianola Community School District are also expected to respect the school community by

dressing appropriately for a K-12 educational environment. Student attire should facilitate participation in

learning as well as the health and safety of students and the adults that supervise them. This policy is

intended to provide guidance for students, staff, and parents. Minimum Requirements:

1. Clothing must cover areas from one armpit across to the other armpit, down to approximately 3 to 4

inches in length on the upper thighs (see images below). Shorts with less than a 4 inch inseam are

discouraged (see images below). Tops must have shoulder straps. 2. Shoes must be worn at all times and should be safe for the

school environment (bedroom shoes or

slippers shall not be worn, except for school activities approved by the principal).

3. See-through or mesh garments must not be worn without appropriate coverage underneath that

meet the minimum requirements of the dress code.

4. Headgear including hats, hoodies, and caps are not allowed unless permitted for religious, medical,

or other reasons by school administration.

5. Specialized courses may require specialized attire, such as sports uniforms or safety gear.

Additional Requirements:

1. Clothing may not depict, imply, advertise, or advocate illegal, violent, or lewd conduct, weapons, or

the use of alcohol, tobacco, marijuana or other controlled substances.

2. Clothing may not depict or imply pornography, nudity, or sexual acts.

3. Clothing may not state, imply, or depict hate speech/imagery targeting groups based on race,

ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, religious affiliation, or any other protected

classification. Symbols that are divisive and have the potential to disrupt the school environment,

such as the Confederate flag, will also not be permitted unless part of an approved educational

activity.

4. Sunglasses may not be worn inside the building.

5. Clothing and accessories that endanger student or staff safety may not be worn.

6. Apparel, jewelry, accessories, tattoos, or manner of grooming that, by virtue of its color,

arrangement, trademark or any other attribute, denotes membership in a gang that advocates

illegal or disruptive behavior is prohibited.

7. Costumes, masks, or painted faces are not allowed unless previously approved by administration

for special events.

8. Students are not allowed to draw, or write on themselves or other students. This is a distraction to

the learning environment.

9. All students will be expected to change into appropriate clothes for physical education classes.

The administration at the middle school reserves the right to determine what constitutes appropriate dress. Students who do not adhere to these guidelines will not be allowed to attend class. Parents will be called if appropriate clothing is not available or the student refuses dress-code appropriate clothing. Additional consequences may be assigned. Appropriate school attire does not draw attention to the student, does not disrupt the concentration of other students, nor disrupts the educational environment.

10 Attendance Facts

The goal of the website Attendance Works is to advance student success by reducing chronic absences. Below, are 10 attendance facts. You can click on <u>this link</u> to read more about each fact.

- 1. Absenteeism in the first month of school can predict poor attendance throughout the school year. Half the students who miss 2-4 days in September go on to miss nearly a month of school.
- 2. Over 8 million U.S. students miss nearly a month of school each year.
- 3. Absenteeism and its ill effects start early. One in 10 kindergarten and first grade students are chronically absent.
- 4. Poor attendance can influence whether children read proficiently by the end of third grade or be held back.
- 5. By 6th grade, chronic absence becomes a leading indicator that a student will drop out of high school.
- 6. Research shows that missing 10 percent of the school, or about 18 days in most school districts, negatively affects a student's academic performance. That's just two days a month and that's known as chronic absence.
- 7. Students who live in communities with high levels of poverty are four times more likely to be chronically absent than others often for reasons beyond their control, such as unstable housing, unreliable transportation and a lack of access to health care.
- 8. When students improve their attendance rates, they improve their academic prospects and chances for graduating.
- 9. Attendance improves when schools engage students and parents in positive ways and when schools provide mentors for chronically absent students.
- 10. Most school districts and states don't look at all the right data to improve school attendance. They track how many students show up every day and how many are skipping school without an excuse, but not how many are missing so many days in excused and unexcused absence that they are headed off track academically.

Battle of the Books

The Battle of the Books (BOB) 2022-23 competition will be online this spring. All interested IMS students are encouraged to read as many BOB books as possible from <u>this list</u>. The books on this list are the Iowa Teen Awards books. This year's competition guest author has yet to be announced, but an extra book will be added to the BOB reading list once this is determined. Further announcements will be made when the guest author's book title is released.

Where to Drop Off and Pick Up Your Students

Students are to be dropped off at the main entrance or fieldhouse entrance in the mornings. Students not involved in morning sports or activities should not arrive before 7:30 a.m.

The 6th grade pick-up zone after school is the fieldhouse parking lot. The 7th grade pick-up zone is the west parking lot in front of the stadium. The 8th grade pick-up zone is the main entrance parking lot. If you have multiple students, you may select the pick-up zone you would like to use.

Requesting a Bus Pass

If your child needs to ride the bus home with a friend, the Transportation department must receive a parent request **no** fewer than 3 business days before the day of the trip to allow proper planning. Passes normally will be approved as long as there is room on the bus and the request is submitted on time. Late Arrivals, Early Dismissals, Absences

Late Arrivals: All students arriving to school after 8:00 will enter through the main entrance and check in to the office. If possible, please call to notify the office before 8:00 or send a note with student stating the reason for the tardy. You <u>do not</u> need to accompany your child into the school for late arrivals.

Early Dismissals: <u>Please notify a secretary in advance if you will be picking your student up early.</u> That way, we can give them a pass to leave the room quietly when it's time. You can do this by having your student bring a note to the office before 8:00, or by calling 515.961.9530 by 8:00, if possible. We ask that you give us notice so that we can avoid disrupting classrooms with phone calls requesting that a child leave the room. <u>A</u> <u>parent/guardian must come into the building to meet their child.</u>

Absences: Please call the attendance line by 8:00 when your student will be absent. Clearly state the child's name, grade, date of absence, and reason for absence. Students may request homework directly from their teachers via email when they are absent two or more days.
