

### Irving Strong Safety

During the month of August, Irving will focus on safety procedures and what it means to be safe. We have a variety of classroom and school-wide safety activities scheduled during the month of August.

Here are a few quotes from staff and students on what safety means to them:

- Safety to me means always following the expectations or directions when given by a trusted adult.
- Being safe to me means taking care of yourself and coming to the health office if you don't feel good or you are hurt.
- One way I stay safe at Irving is to line up when the whistle blows so I don't get left outside.
- I stay safe by not running in the hall.
- I stay safe in the gym by looking where I go.

- Look both ways before crossing the street.
- Safety means using the equipment safely and staying on the right side of the hallway.
- Being safe is no running in the hallway, no jumping off of things, and listening to your teacher.
- You're protected and you don't get hurt.
- Safety means listening to the teachers and following directions.

### **Heartland AEA Hearing Tests**

#### Dear Parent or Guardian:

Heartland AEA will conduct hearing screenings this school year for Kindergarten through 2nd and 5th grade students.

We encourage you to watch a 2½ minute video with your younger student showing what we do during a hearing screening. The video can be found at: <a href="https://youtu.be/ZH5RtzpTJw4">https://youtu.be/ZH5RtzpTJw4</a>. It will help your student know what to expect when it's their turn to play the listening game!



Students who do not pass this screening may receive a hearing test by the audiologist at school. Parents will be **notified** about the results **only if there is a concern**. This is a screening program and does not identify all hearing or ear problems. If your student has recently had hearing or ear problems, feel free to send this information to the school nurse to share with the audiologist.

If you do not want your student to receive a hearing screening, please notify the school. If there are any questions about the hearing screening program in your school, please contact your school nurse or principal.

### **Building Notes**

The bell rings at 7:50 AM. Your child will be counted tardy starting at 7:51 either as excused:

- illness,
- · family emergencies,
- recognized religious observances,
- to accompany parents out of town, to attend funerals, etc.;
- appointments that cannot be scheduled outside the school day,
- school-sponsored or approved activities;

or unexcused with no note from the parent or for simply being late. Unexcused absences also include, but are not limited to:

- shopping,
- hunting,
- concerts,

- preparation/participation in parties/ celebrations,
- and employment.

You are now able to view absences and tardies by accessing your PowerSchool portal account.

As a courtesy, please call or email any changes to your child's pick-up arrangements for that day by **12:30 PM** unless you have an emergency.

### **Exiting the Building:**

- **Kindergarten, 2**<sup>nd</sup> **and 4**<sup>th</sup> **grades** will enter/exit through the **southwest doors**.
- 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grades will enter/exit through the north door.

Families with children in multiple grade levels may decide on one designated pick-up area. Please notify the classroom teachers of your decision.

### Guidelines for Indoor Recess:

If the temperature and/or feels-like temperature is 10° or less or 100° and above, students stay inside for recess.

Students will also come into the building starting at 7:30 in the morning.



Cell Phones/Electronic Communication Devices

Students may possess a cellular telephone or other electronic communication devices (ECD) in school and at school related functions provided that during school hours and on school vehicles the cell phone or ECD is powered off, concealed and not in use.

Students are prohibited from using a cell phone or having it powered on during the school day.

#### **Notes from the Transportation Department:**

All bus students are expected to wear their seat belt during their bus route. If you child is having trouble with the seat belt, please ask the bus driver for help.

The middle school is a transfer point **only** for before and after school. Parents should be dropping off and picking up their children at their attendance center if they have plans other than their typical bussing needs.

According to the Student Transportation Handbook (found on the Indianola website): '. . . Elementary parents cannot pick up or drop off elementary students at the Middle School for transportation.'

\*\*\*NEW\*\*\*: Starting this school year, bus passes will now be approved by the Transportation Department and not your student's school office. The request will need to be submitted **no fewer than 3 business days** before the day of the trip to allow for proper planning. Passes normally will be approved as long as there is room on the bus and the request is submitted on time. #### Dear Families:

Our student drop-off/pick-up procedures are designed to maintain a safe and orderly arrival and dismissal for you, our students, and our staff. The following guidelines provide a general awareness to all involved as well as provide information that will help expedite the process.



### Safety Rules

- Vehicles MAY NOT BE LEFT UNATTENDED in the "car rider lane" on Clinton Street from 7:30-8:20 AM and 2:40-3:25 PM. If you must leave your vehicle, please use an official parking space.
- Listen to school personnel for directions.
- Always be on the lookout for others.
- There will be one lane for pick-up/drop-off on Clinton Avenue. No double and triple parking.
- Students will not be allowed to go in-between cars to get to their own vehicle for drop off/pick-up.
- Students will not be allowed to load and unload in the intersection of Clinton and D Street or Detroit and D Street.
- Parents should not park behind the parked cars along the fence to the playground or on D Street to load or unload their student(s).

#### **Student Arrival Directions**

- Parents will not be able to enter the building at this time.
- All students must be supervised. Irving Elementary will provide supervision beginning at 7:30 AM.
- On Clinton Street, please pull all the way to the west end of the car rider lane and unload close to the ramp.
- Please have your student prepared to exit the vehicle at the appropriate time to keep traffic flowing.
- Students may not be dropped off from the street on Detroit or D Street. Please
  utilize the Simpson parking lots on the north side of Irving and have the students
  cross at the crosswalk.
- Students MUST be IN CLASS at 7:50 AM. They are tardy at 7:51 AM.

#### Student Dismissal Directions

- Dismissal for bus begins at 3:00. Only bus students may be dismissed at this time.
- If you need to pick your child up early, you will need to park in an official parking
  place, come into the main office and sign your child out.
- Dismissal for car riders and walkers begins at 3:05.
- Dismissal areas-
  - North Door—1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grades
  - Southwest Door—Kindergarten, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grades
    - Families with children in multiple grade levels may decide on one designated pick-up area. Please notify the classroom teachers of your decision.



- Please pull all the way up to the ramp area to allow us to load the maximum number of cars at one time. (All students will come from the ramp area on the west end of the building.)
- With proper flow, approximately 4-5 cars can pick up at one time, leave and then allow 4-5 more cars to pick up near the ramp.
- Teachers will be there to assist students to get to their car. PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE YOUR CAR UNATTENDED IN THE PICK-UP LANE.

### Other Available Options

- There are two Simpson parking lots to the north of the building where you can plan to meet your child after school.
- Parking is also available on one of the side streets in the area. You may park and walk to meet your child at school.
- If your child qualifies for transportation services, they may utilize the District's busing.
- The Simpson parking lot on the south side of Clinton IS NOT available for parents to utilize before and after school for parking.

We ask for your focus and patience as all parents and students learn the new procedures. Please remember that traffic is always heavier at the start of the school year, so plan your time accordingly. The Indianola Police Department will be prominent during the first week and a half of school to help maintain procedures and traffic flow.
