Late Arrivals, Early Dismissals, Absences

Attendance Line Phone Number: 515.961.9530 x3162. (Please call this extension to report Absences and Late Arrivals.)

Late Arrivals: All students arriving to school after 8:10 will enter through the main entrance and check in to the office. If possible, please call to notify the office before 8:10 or send a note with student stating the reason for the tardy. You <u>do not</u> need to accompany your child into the school for late arrivals.

Early Dismissals: Please notify a secretary in advance if you will be picking your student up early. That way, we can give him a pass to leave the room quietly when it's time. You can do this by having your student bring a note to the office before 8:10, or by calling 515.961.9530 by 8:10, if possible. We ask that you give us notice so that we can avoid disrupting classrooms with phone calls requesting that a child leave the room. A parent/guardian must come into the office and sign their student out when leaving early.

Absences: Please call the attendance line by 8:10 when your student will be absent. Clearly state the child's name, grade, date of absence, and reason for absence. Homework may be requested when a student is absent for two or more days. Please make those requests before 9:00 to have the work ready for a pick-up time between 2:30 and 4:00.

Attendance Policy—Please Read

Dear Parent/Guardians:

Welcome to the Indianola Community School District. Regular attendance is essential for students to obtain maximum benefits from the educational opportunities provided at school. Every day at school is important. Written assignments and reading selections are only a portion of the "work" and classroom activities that take place during the school day. Iowa Code Chapter 299 requires compulsory daily school attendance for students 6-16 years of age. Our District staff continues the commitment to seeing our school's academic programs improve. Maximizing children's achievement must begin with daily attendance and we feel it is everyone's responsibility. Daily school attendance must start at home with the importance and value of education being stressed. It is vital for the Indianola Community School District to build on this value, maintaining the essential partnership between school and home to ensure daily attendance. If your child is absent, Iowa Code 299 and District board policy 501.9 allows excused absences for the following reasons:

- 1. Illness
- 2. Family emergencies
- 3. Recognized religious observances and funeral services
- 4. Medical appointments that cannot be scheduled outside the school day and school-sponsored or approved activities

The parent/guardian of the student must send a note and/or notify the middle school main office to clear any of these excused absences. Failure to notify the office of the absence will result in a recorded unexcused absence on the student's permanent record. Be advised that our District Board policy 501.3 requires the parent of a child to provide evidence of the child's mental and physical inability to attend school

Unexcused attendance includes, but is not limited to, the following conditions:

- A student is absent from school or assigned area without the knowledge and consent of school personnel or parent. Truancy is the act of being absent without a reasonable excuse. These absences will include, but not be limited to: tardiness, shopping, hunting, concerts, preparation or participation in parties and other celebrations, and employment.
- A student leaves the school building, grounds, or any assigned area without first obtaining permission from the nurse, office personnel, teacher or administrator.
- A student does not report to a class or other assigned area as required.

We understand that being absent from school is sometimes necessary. However, Indianola Middle School staff believes that students missing school no matter what the reason jeopardizes their ability to effectively use the school program. Effective communication and notification are first steps toward improving student attendance. School staff may request your attendance at a conference when your child is absent from school for reasons that are not excused. Please review the attendance information located on page 7-10 of the Indianola Middle School Handbook with your child and take the necessary measures to correct any potential attendance problems. We appreciate your assistance in making school attendance a priority.

Internet Safety-IOWA and Beyond!

The Internet has drastically changed the way we all interact, socialize and define the world. Youth today have access to in-depth knowledge, tools to express their creativity, and the ability to interact with people all over the world, yet, along with offering a fascinating way to connect with the world, the Internet also offers many risks. Some of those risks are:

- Cyberbullying
- Exposure to inappropriate material
 - Sexting
 - Identity Theft
- Online predators/Online Sexploitation
- Revealing too much personal information

Learning to recognize the warning signs of these risks will allow trusted adults to intervene and lessen potential negative impacts. By acting as a resource, parents, teachers, librarians, coaches, etc., can help make the Internet a safer place. Staying well-informed about current issues, in order to understand what children/youth are experiencing on and off the Internet, will also help to safeguard kids. Youth today "live" through social networking. They use instant messaging, Facebook, Twitter, Snap Chat, KIK, and many other apps, webcams, or blogging, to define their lives. You can help them use these tools safely by learning how to use them yourself and be aware of what happens here in lowa. Youth, who get upto-date, real world information and education, are more likely to exhibit responsible behavior and make safer choices while on-line.

Participation in this survey is anonymous and strictly voluntary. No student is required to fill out the questionnaire. The survey will take one class period, approximately 40 minutes, to complete.

Rules below:

Appropriate School Attire (Ref. School Board Policy 502.1)

Appropriate school attire does not draw attention to the student, does not disrupt the concentration of other students, nor disrupts the educational environment.

It is expected that students' clothing will ensure adequate coverage and undergarments should not be visible. Garments may not be backless or without straps, if applicable. Shorts with less than a 4 inch inseam are discouraged.

Pants and shorts are to be worn at an appropriate level at or above the hips.

Shoes with wheels are prohibited.

Students are not to wear items that are considered potentially dangerous.

All students will be expected to change into appropriate clothes for physical education classes.

Students are expected to refrain from wearing clothing or other apparel with actual or implied profanity, sexual innuendos, and tobacco/alcohol/drug endorsements, promotion of weapons or known gang related insignias.

The building principals will make the final determination of the appropriateness of the student's appearance.

Activity Passes

Students will receive an ID card on the first day of school. If you purchased an activity pass for your child, there will be a red "18" sticker attached to the ID. If you purchased one but there is not a sticker, remind your child to stop in to the main office to get it. Students will be reminded of this during daily announcements, as well. If you haven't purchased an activity pass, there is still time. The cost is \$50 and it allows your student entry into home high school and middle school athletic events and some music events. You may purchase this pass in the front office (cash or check only) or click here and select Middle School.
