

Student Classroom Placement for 2018-2019

<u>Assigning Students to Classrooms</u> - Elementary teachers will soon begin assigning students to classrooms for next school year. Students will be assigned to classes for next school year by their current teachers and administrator, who are in the best position to make these recommendations. The teachers have worked with the children throughout the year and are able to identify their strengths and areas of needed support. Teachers consider many factors as balanced classes are prepared. These factors include:

-academic abilities -social skills -gender balance -individual learning styles and needs -student personality and interactions -combinations of students to avoid -class size

<u>The Goal of the Classroom Assignment Process</u> - The goal of the class assignment process is to produce a diverse combination of student groups who will work well together in the academic setting. This important task is vital to the creation of a positive class environment, which enables students to function to the best of their abilities. Students are assigned to classes based upon the best possible match of teaching skills and interpersonal needs of students.

<u>Parent Input – We Need Your Support and Input!</u> - Parents who feel the need to provide input about their child's placement should contact the building administrator or pick up the Elementary Parent Input form from the school office. It is important to note that a request for a specific teacher is not appropriate. When providing input, please consider the items listed above. It is best to communicate a child's strengths or weaknesses in writing to the administrator. It is important to note that when providing input, the information will be considered during the class placement process. However, the act of submitting a written information or request does not guarantee placement in a particular class.

Please respect the teachers' and administrators' professional judgment. It is important to note that the teachers and administrator hand place every child. We have each student's best interests in mind as class selections are made. Please have your request into the school by Friday, April 27, 2018.

Please Bring Your License when you Visit the School

If you have been a visitor to any of our Indianola schools during a typical day, you have been asked to show your license the first time so that a sticker could be given to you before you walk around the building.

We will be getting an upgrade to this security screening system, which is a good thing. However, we will not have access to past visitor records, so we will need to scan every person's license/ID as if it were their first visit. This upgrade will take place over winter break, so, beginning January 3, 2018, every visitor will be required to show their license. Please keep in mind, if you are just coming into the main office you will not need to show your ID. If you are going anywhere

else in the building during school hours, however, you will. Thank you for your cooperation.

Visitor Information to enter Emerson Elementary School

* Driver's License – Bring your driver's license to the office when you visit.

It will be scanned in order to issue a visitor's badge. This is a required step.

* Check out – You are required to check out of the building when your visit is over and return your visitor's badge to the office. The secretary will sign you out at that time.

* Allow Extra Time – The checking in process does take a few extra minutes, so if you want to be able to be in the building at a specific time, allow 10 extra minutes just to be sure. We don't want you to miss a classroom event or a visit with your child.
