PROM INFORMATION

PROM: The 2023 Indianola High School Prom “Under The Stars” will be held on **Saturday, April 22nd at Adventureland’s Palace Theatre from 8:00 - 11:00 p.m.** with doors opening at 7:30 p.m. Doors will close at 9:00 p.m. and the dance is closed to the public. **A concession stand will be available for attendees to purchase drinks and snacks; must use debit/credit card to purchase.**

PROM TICKETS will go on sale Monday, April 10th, BEFORE (7:15 a.m. to 7:45 a.m.) AND AFTER SCHOOL (3:10 p.m. to 3:30p.m.) and will end on Friday, April 14th.

Juniors and Seniors are the ONLY students that can purchase a dance ticket. The ticket table will be located outside the High School Main Office. If you are bringing an outside date, they MUST be under the age of 21 and you will register them when you purchase your tickets. Ticket price is \$20 per attendee. If you haven’t paid your Junior Fundraiser fee, the ticket price is \$60.

GRAND MARCH: Prior to Prom, we will hold our annual community event, The Grand March, in the high school north gym from 4:30-5:30 p.m. Attendees that choose to participate may come and go at any time during this event. **IT IS NOT REQUIRED BUT ENCOURAGED.** This event is free to the public. Family/friends that wish to observe will enter at the north gym doors and be seated in the west side bleachers. Attendees will use the gates by the tennis courts and enter the gym on the north side. Signs will be posted. It is a tradition where students and their guests are introduced to the public prior to the dance. The prom attendees will parade across the gym floor in a lighted pathway to the magical center spotlight. You are welcome to take pictures inside the gym at your seats, in the hallway where there will be a hedge wall available to take additional photos.

POST PROM will be held at the Blake Fieldhouse and will run from 11:00pm-2:00am on April 22nd for all seniors, juniors and their guests. **Doors will open at 10:30 pm and close at midnight. NO LATE ADMITTANCE!** Sign up when you purchase your tickets, in the main office or check your emails. Deadline to RSVP is Wednesday, April 19.
