1. [12 Angry Villians- directors Matt Winjum and Suzi Fredricks](#)
 - a. Summary: A parody of Reginald Rose's *Twelve Angry Men (Jurors)*, *12 Angry Villains* follows the trial of Peter Pan who has allegedly murdered an innocent pirate named Captain Hook. A jury of twelve of the most famous villains will decide Pan's fate, if only they could stop arguing long enough to take a vote. The jury votes 11-1 that Peter Pan is guilty, but the law requires a unanimous vote by all 12 jurors to sentence the boy to adulthood. During a heated debate, new uncertainties come to light, forcing everyone to truly question if there is in fact some measure of "reasonable doubt".
 - b. Roles: 5 Female, 7 Male, & 2 Any

2. [Just Like I Wanted - directors Peyton Powers and Tarah Cashen](#)
 - a. Summary: At sixteen, Joey has just committed suicide. Through narration and a series of flashbacks, Joey shows us the life he used to lead and why he chose to end it -- but we also see the unexpected effect of his death on his classmates, teachers, and family.
 - b. Roles: 8 female, 7 male, 1 any

3. [Sofa Spud - directors Sam Burns, Michael Rothchild, and Larry Schippers](#)
 - a. *Sofa Spud* is a parody of the one-act *Couch Potato* by Patrick Gabridge. Stan lives for two things - government conspiracy theories and the sofa. However, Stan has worn out his welcome, and his sister, Francine, and her husband want him out. However, it looks like the only way to get him out is to move out themselves -- leaving him behind. What happens next is anyone's guess.

Lifeguard: American Red Cross Certification Courses

Pre-Requisites:

- Minimum age: 15 years
- Swim 300 yards continuously.
- Tread water for 2 minutes using only the legs.
- Complete a timed event within 1 minute, 40 seconds.
- Starting in the water, swim 20 yards.
- Surface dive to a depth of 7 to 10 feet to retrieve a 10-pound object.
- Return to the surface and swim 20 yards on the back to return to the starting point.
- Exit the water without using a ladder or steps.

Blended Course: Participants will be sent a link for the online learning portion 2 - 3 weeks before the class. Online course work must be completed 3-5 days before the start date of class
