#### **East Side of Square**

George Washington Carver was a **Treasure** to everyone he met and our newspapers reported on what he was doing and where he was going his whole life

#### **Southeast Off Square**

Unable to **Savor The Rise** as an artist, George Carver studied agriculture and dedicated his life to helping farmers

George Carver had strong **Roots** and followed his dreams despite difficulties

#### **South Side of Square**

George Carver was a **Pageturner**, reading as many books as he could

- Getting an education was important and difficult

George Washington Carver had a great spirit and **Soulful** heart. He took walks in the woods almost every day to find ideas and inspiration

#### **West Side of Square**

George W Carver had many **Creations** and found ways to use plants others considered a weed

- He said, “A weed is just a plant in the wrong location”

Professor Carver wanted to **Feed and Foster** the poor farmer and his Jessup Wagon was a traveling classroom for teaching farmers

George Carver was skilled in knitting and **Stitchery**, mending his clothes, which he wore until they were tattered and threadbare

Inside the **Corner Sundry**, find the 1890 photo when the Square was “wired” for electricity

- George Carver was here when they threw the switch for the new electric lights

#### **Southwest Off Square**

George Washington Carver felt a **Connection** with everything in nature and always had a fresh flower in the buttonhole of his jacket

- Inside are sculptures created by Indianola Middle School students depicting the life of Professor Carver

George Carver lived and ran a laundry business inside a **Little Shed**

- He worked hard and shopped on the Square for everything he needed

#### **North Side of Square**

George Carver studied botany and understood the value and importance of all living things

- Dissect and pollinate flowers at **Ouderkirk Law Firm**; hosted by ICSD Elementary Science classrooms

#### **Northeast Off Square**

Step inside **McCoy’s Hardware** for a display from the Carver Museum and then plant seeds
